[S. 4.] RESOLVE in favor of Benjamin R. Walker and Joseph C. Walker.

Resolved, That the land agent be, and he is hereby

- 2 authorized to convey to Benjamin R. Walker and
- 3 Joseph C. Walker, lot numbered twenty-two, in town-
- 4 ship numbered four, in the fourth range, west from
- 5 the east line of the state, in the county of Aroostook,
- 6 now town of Island Falls, waiving all further settling
- 7 duties.

STATEMENT OF FACTS.

To the Hon. Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled:

The undersigned, local agent for settling lands in No. 4, range 4, (Island Falls) would respectfully represent that Benjamin R. Walker contracted for a lot of land in said town of Island Falls, lot No. 22, in August, 1872; that said lot lies back from any road; that said Benjamin R. and Joseph C. Walker have purchased another lot, or part of lot, lying adjacent thereto—No. 9. I would further represent that Benjamin R. and Joseph C. Walker have fully paid for lot No. 22 by labor on the road; that they have a good barn; that they have each a comfortable house on lot No. 9, and are occupying them with their families, and that they have the requisite quantity cleared to entitle them each to a deed of a lot of land. I would therefore respectfully request you to authorize the Land Agent to deed said lot without any other settling duties being performed.
