STATE OF MAINE.

[S. 20.] RESOLVE in favor of the military and naval asylum at Bath.

Resolved, That the sum of eight thousand dollars be,

- 2 and hereby is appropriated for the use of the military
- 3 and naval asylum at Bath; and that the further sum
- 4 of five hundred dollars be, and is hereby appropriated,
- 5 to be expended under the direction of the trustees of
- 6 the asylum for the building of cisterns or a reservoir.

STATEMENT OF FACTS.

The Committee, availing themselves of the privilege granted by the Legislature, visited the Military and Naval Asylum at Bath and found the institution under general good management. Owing to an increase in the number of inmates the Trustees ask an increased appropriation, which the Committee recommend. The cisterns were entirely dry, and the Asylum dependant for water on what was hauled from a distance, and melting snow. Hence we recommend an appropriation of five hundred dollars for the purpose of building cisterns, or a reservoir.
