STATE OF MAINE.

[S. 21.] RESOLVE in favor of Van Buren plantation.

Resolved, That the sum of two hundred dellars be, 2 and is hereby appropriated and paid to the plantation 3 of Van Buren, when the county commissioners of the 4 county of Aroostook shall certify to the state treasurer 5 that a good and substantial bridge has been built over 6 Thibodeau's stream (so called) in said plantation of 7 Van Buren.

STATEMENT OF FACTS.

It is very important that a bridge be built about six miles above Violette Brook, in Van Buren Plantation. That the inhabitants are not able to erect the same without assistance. The amount of the resolve would not build the bridge, but it would assist the inhabitants so far that, with the appropriation, they could complete the same.
