STATE OF MAINE.

[S. 23.] RESOLVE in favor of the town of Kingsbury.

Resolved, That the sum of two hundred dollars be,
2 and is hereby appropriated in aid of the town of
3 Kingsbury, in the county of Piscataquis, to be ex-
4 pended under direction of the county commissioners
5 of said county, in building state road leading from
6 Kingsbury Mills to Blanchard.

STATEMENT OF FACTS.

The State road leading from Kingsbury Mills to Blanchard, thirteen miles, has never been completed and is not passable with safety. Some distance has only been grubbed out, but never been turnpiked. The petitioners ask for eight hundred dollars. The town cannot complete the road, owing to the large amount of road building incumbent on the town. The State road is of great public importance, being the thoroughfare for travel to Moosehead Lake, over which stages daily pass.
