## STATE OF MAINE.

RESOLVE in favor of the Passamaquoddy Indians.

Resolved, That there be paid from the state treasury, 2 to be expended under the direction of the governor 3 and council, to the agent of the Passamaquoddy tribe 4 of Indians, for the benefit of said tribe, as follows, viz: 5 For May dividend, four hundred dollars; for Novem-6 ber dividend, three hundred dollars; for distressed 7 poor, two thousand dollars; for agricultural purposes, 8 five hundred dollars; for bounty on crops for the year 9 eighteen hundred and seventy-eight, three hundred 10 dollars; for ploughing, one hundred and fifty dollars; 11 for salaries of governors, one hundred dollars; for 12 salaries of lieutenant governors, forty dollars; for wood, 13 two hundred dollars; for repairs on road leading from 14 Peter Dana's point to Granger turnpike, fifty dollars; 15 for contingent expenses, one hundred dollars; for edu-16 cational purposes, three hundred dollars; for salary of

- 17 priest, one hundred dollars; for dressing for land, one
- 18 hundred dollars; for salary of agent, three hundred
- 19 dollars; for overdrawn balance for the year eighteen
- 20 hundred and seventy-seven, three hundred and ten
- 21 dollars and fifty-nine cents; for contingent poor fund,
- 22 five hundred dollars.
