STATE OF MAINE.

RESOLVE in favor of the town of Frenchville, formerly town of Dickeyville.

Resolved, That there be appropriated to the town of 2 Frenchville, formerly town of Dickeyville, the sum of 3 seventy-three dollars and two cents, and that the same 4 be credited to said town on its state tax of eighteen 5 hundred and seventy-seven, the same having been 6 collected of said town in excess of the amount required 7 under chapter two hundred and seventy-four and 8 chapter two hundred and seventy of the private and 9 special laws of eighteen hundred and sixty-nine.

STATEMENT OF FACTS.

By chapter 72 of the resolves of 1869, approved Feb. 10, the valuation of Dickeyville, now town of Frenchville, was fixed at fifty-seven thousand one hundred seven dollars.

Under chapter 274 of private and special laws of same year, approved March 13, the town was assessed under the name of Dionne plantation, \$474.54, and the same was paid. By chapter 270, approved same day, an amendatory act, the amount was fixed at \$401.52. Hence, it will be seen, that the town paid \$73.02 more than required.
