STATE OF MAINE.

RESOLVE in favor of the town of Fort Kent.

Resolved, That there be appropriated to the town of
2 Fort Kent the sum of eighty-six dollars and sixteen
3 cents, and the same be credited to said town on its
4 state tax of eighteen hundred and seventy-seven, the
5 same having been collected of said town in excess of
6 the amount required under chapter two hundred and
7 seventy-four and chapter two hundred and seventy of
8 the private and special laws of eighteen hundred and
9 sixty-nine.

STATEMENT OF FACTS.

The plantations of Fort Kent and about three-fourths of Daigle, were incorporated into a town by name of Fort Kent, by act approved Feb. 23, 1869, chapter 156 of private and special laws. By chapter 72 of resolves of same year, approved March 10th, the valuation of Fort Kent was fixed at \$40,000. Under chapter 274 of private and special laws of same year, approved March 13, Fort Kent and Daigle plantations were assessed \$317.32, and this amount was collected of the town of Fort Kent. By chapter 270 of private and special laws of same year, approved March 13, a tax was assessed upon the town of Fort Kent of \$231.16. Hence, it will be seen, that \$86.16 was collected of the town more than required.
