STATE OF MAINE.

RESOLVE in favor of Charles C. Libby.

Resolved, That the land agent be, and he is hereby 2 authorized to convey to Charles C. Libby, the south-3 east quarter of section number thirty-one, in township 4 number nine, range six, west from the east line of the 5 state, on payment by said Libby of ten dollars in cash, 6 such conveyance to be in full for all road labor over-7 paid on said lot.

STATEMENT OF FACTS.

Ox Bow, November, 1877.

To the Honorable Senate and House of Representatives of Maine in Legislature assembled :
