RESOLVE in favor O. W. Davis, Jr.

---

*Resolved,* That the land agent be authorized to convey to O. W. Davis, Jr., lot number nineteen, in Wade plantation, whenever said Davis shall have paid for the same in road labor at fifty cents per acre, and twenty cents per acre additional thereto in cash, and shall prove that he is the lawful holder of the land certificate of said lot.

## STATEMENT OF FACTS.

---

To the Honorable Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled:

Owen W. Davis, Jr., of Bangor, humbly petitioning, represents that he has become the purchaser of all the rights which David Randall had in lot No. 19, in township No. 13, range 4, now called Wade plantation, in Aroostook county, containing 89 44-100 acres, according to the survey of said township by Thomas Sawyer, Jr., in 1839, which said lot was purchased and settled by said David Randall, as appears by the certificate given to him by Parker P. Burleigh, land agent, on the 28th day of August, 1872, upon which said premises said Randall built a comfortable dwelling-house and established his residence, and made some clearings thereon, but did not in all respects strictly comply with all the requirements of the statutes in respect to settlers on public lands, and did not therefore receive a deed thereof. Your petitioner therefore prays that a resolve may be passed authorizing a conveyance of said lot to him.
