STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED AND SEVENTY-EIGHT.

AN ACT to establish a bounty on bears.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

- SECTION 1. A bounty of three dollars for every bear
- 2 killed in any town in this state shall be paid by the
- 3 treasurer thereof to the person killing it, on his com-
- 4 plying with the following provisions.
 - Sect. 2. No bounty shall be paid unless the person
- 2 claiming it within ten days after he has killed such
- 3 animal, or within ten days after he has returned from
- 4 the hunting in which he killed it, exhibits to the town
- 5 treasurer the entire skin thereof with the ears and nose
- 6 on it in as perfect a state as when killed, except nat-
- 7 ural decay, and signs and makes oath to a certificate,

8 which oath said treasurer is hereby authorized to ad9 minister, in which he shall state that he killed such
10 animal, and the time when, and the place where, he
11 killed it, showing it to be within this state; and the
12 said treasurer shall thereupon cut off the whole of the
13 ears and the whole of the nose from such skin, and
14 entirely destroy them by burning; then he shall pay
15 the bounty and take the receipt of the claimant there16 for upon the same paper with such certificate. The
17 treasurer shall immediately make upon the same paper
18 a certificate, under oath, addressed to the treasurer of
19 state, that he first cut off the ears and nose from the
20 skin of such animal and destroyed them by burning,
21 and then paid the said bounty to the claimant.

SECT. 3. Said certificates and receipts shall annually, 2 in the month of December, be transmitted to the treas-3 urer of state, and by him laid before the legislature as 4 early as convenient; and when allowed by the legis-5 lature shall be paid by the treasurer of state to such 6 towns.

SECT. 4. The certificates shall be in form as follows:

Claimant's certificate.

3 To the treasurer of . I hereby certify that on 4 the day of A. D. 187 at , in the State 5 of Maine, I killed the bear the skin of which I now

6	exhibit to you; and I claim the bounty allowed by
7	law for killing the same.
8	Dated at this day of A. D. 18
9	Claimant's receipt.
10	On this day of A.D. 18, I received of
11	treasurer of dollars, being the bounty allowed
12	by law for killing the bear described in the above
13	certificate. —— — Claimant.
14	Treasurer's certificate.
1 5	I hereby certify, that as required by law, I first cut
16	off the whole of the ears and nose from the skin of
17	the bear described in the foregoing certificate, and
18	destroyed the same by burning, and then paid to the
1 9	said the bounty for which I have taken his re-
20	ceipt as above.
