STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED AND SEVENTY-EIGHT.

AN ACT to prevent frauds in commercial fertilizers.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

SECTION 1. Every package of fifty pounds or more 2 of commercial manure or fertilizer, sold or kept for 3 sale at over one cent a pound, unless prepared essen-4 tially from fish and sold as such, shall be marked with 5 its weight, the name and place of business of the 6 manufacturer and seller, and with a true analysis of 7 the chemical elements and the several amounts of each 8 contained therein.

SECT. 2. Any person guilty of a violation of section 2 one, shall be subjected to a penalty of one hundred 3 dollars.

SECT. 3. The secretary of the state board of agri-2 culture may procure the analysis of any fertilizer 3 offered for sale within the state, and prosecute any 4 person who shall violate the provisions of this act.
