RESOLVE in favor of Jeremiah Crouse.

Resolved, That the land agent be authorized to convey

- 2 to Jeremiah Crouse lot number thirty-one in township
- 3 number thirteen, range three, west from the east line
- 4 of the state, waiving further settling duties.

STATEMENT OF FACTS.

To the Honorable Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled:

The undersigned petitioner certifies, that he is owner of land certificate for lot of land numbered thirty-one (31), township thirteen (13), range three (3), now Washburn. That said lot lays back from any road, and is unfit for a farm, being a swamp lot; that all the road labor has been performed under the direction of the local agent. Your petitioner therefore asks that the Land Agent be authorized to deed him the said lot, waiving further settling duties, and as in duty bound will ever pray.
