STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED AND SEVENTY-EIGHT.

AN ACT to amend section fifty of chapter forty of revised statutes, relating to migratory fishes in Damariscotta river.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows :

Section fifty of chapter forty of the revised statutes, 2 is hereby amended by striking out the words “ Dama- 3 riscotta river,” in the fifth and sixth lines of said sec- 4 tion, and inserting in the place thereof the words “ so 5 much of the waters of Damariscotta river as are west 6 of the railroad bridge near Damariscotta mill,” so that 7 said section as amended shall read as follows :

8 *Sect. 50.* The following waters and their tributaries 9 are exempt from the operation of the provisions of this

10 chapter relating to the migratory fishes, and the super-
11 vision of fishways by the commissioners, that is to say:
12 Royall's river in North Yarmouth, Sewall's pond or its
13 outlet in Arrowsic, Nequasset stream in Woolwich, so
14 much of the waters of Damariscotta river as are west
15 of the railroad bridge near Damariscotta mills; Duck
16 trap stream in Lincolnville and Belmont, the eastern
17 Penobscot river in Orland, Winslow's and Leach's
18 streams in Penobscot; all waters in Vinalhaven, Blue-
19 hill, Tremont, Mount Desert, Eden, Franklin and Sul-
20 livan, Tunk river in Steuben, Pleasant river in Wash-
21 ington county, East Machias river, and Coboscook or
22 Orange river in Whiting.
