STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED AND SEVENTY-EIGHT.

AN ACT to amend section twenty-six of chapter ninety of the public laws of eighteen hundred and seventy-six, in relation to lime rock and slate.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

Section twenty-six of chapter ninety of the public

- 2 laws of eighteen hundred and seventy-six, is hereby
- 3 amended by striking out in the eleventh line, after the
- 4 word "slate," the words "arrives at their port of ship-
- 5 ment," and inserting in the place thereof, "is so mined,
- 6 quarried, or manufactured, unless the same before that
- 7 time is loaded on cars or vessels for transportation," so
- 8 that section shall read as follows:
- 9 Sect. 26. Any person who digs, hauls or furnishes

10 rock for the manufacture of lime, has a lien thereon 11 for his personal services and the rock so furnished, for 12 thirty days after such rock is manufactured into lime, 13 or until such lime is sold or shipped on board a vessel; 14 any person who labors in quarrying or cutting and 15 dressing granite in any quarry, has a lien for the wages 16 of his labor on all the granite quarried or cut and 17 dressed in the quarry by him or his co-laborers, for 18 thirty days after such granite is cut and dressed, or 19 until such granite is sold or shipped on board a vessel; 20 any person who labors in mining, quarrying or manu-21 facturing slate in any quarry, has a lien for the wages 22 of his labor on all slate mined, quarried or manufac-23 tured in the quarry by him or his co-laborers for thirty 24 days after the slate is so mined, quarried or manufac-25 tured, unless the same before that time is loaded on 26 cars or vessels for transportation. Such liens shall have 27 precedence of all other claims, and may be enforced 28 by attachment within the times aforesaid.
