STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED AND
SEVENTY-EIGHT.

AN ACT to prohibit the taking of fish from Withers'
pond and its tributaries, in the town of Dover.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives
in Legislature assembled, as follows:*

SECTION 1. All persons are forbidden to take fish of
2 any kind in any manner from Withers' mill pond or its
3 tributaries, in the town of Dover, county of Piscata-
4 quis, for the term of two years.

SECT. 2. Any person violating the provisions of this
2 act shall pay the sum of five dollars for each fish
3 taken, to be recovered on complaint before any trial
4 justice in said county, or before any court having
5 jurisdiction in the case, one-half to the use of the
6 complainant, and one-half to the use of the town of
7 Dover aforesaid.

SECT. 3. This act shall take effect when approved.
