
STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED AND SEVENTY-EIGHT.

AN ACT to prohibit the taking of fish from Withers' pond and its tributaries, in the town of Dover.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

- SECTION 1. All persons are forbidden to take fish of
- 2 any kind in any manner from Withers' mill pond or its
- 3 tributaries, in the town of Dover, county of Piscata-
- 4 quis, for the term of two years.
 - SECT. 2. Any person violating the provisions of this
- 2 act shall pay the sum of five dollars for each fish
- 3 taken, to be recovered on complaint before any trial
- 4 justice in said county, or before any court having
- 5 jurisdiction in the case, one-half to the use of the
- 6 complainant, and one-half to the use of the town of
- 7 Dover aforesaid.
 - SECT. 3. This act shall take effect when approved.
