STATE OF MAINE.

RESOLVE in aid of township number three, range three, and township number four, range three, in Somerset county.

Resolved, That five hundred dollars be appropriated

- 2 to assist townships number three, range three, and
- 3 township number four, range three, Bingham's pur-
- 4 chase, west of Kennebec river in Somerset county, to
- 5 build a road leading from White's ferry to the south
- 6 end of Flagstaff bridge through said townships, the
- 7 same to be expended under the direction of the county
- 8 commissioners of Somerset county.

STATEMENT OF FACTS.

This road leads from White's Ferry, on the south side of Dead River, to the south end of Flagstaff bridge, a distance of six miles. The road has been partly built, so that it is now open for winter travel. The townships through which it passes have been nearly all burnt over, and there is very little settling land in them, and it would be nearly impossible to build said road without aid from the State. All the travel to the settlements on the Dead river would pass over this road, as would all the lumbering travel for Western Somerset County. There are not a half dozen settlers in said townships.
