STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED AND SEVENTY-EIGHT.

AN ACT to encourage the planting of trees.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

The inhabitants of any town, liable to a highway

- 2 tax, who shall transplant by the side of the highway,
- 3 upon his own land, any forest shade trees, of any
- 4 suitable size, shall be allowed by the selectmen of the
- 5 town an abatement in his highway tax of one dollar
- 6 for every four trees so planted; but no row of elms
- 7 shall be planted nearer each other in line than seventy
- 8 feet, no maples or other forest trees nearer than fifty
- 9 feet; and no allowance or abatement shall be made
- 10 unless the trees were set out at least two years' pre-
- 11 vious to the demand therefor, and are living at the
- 12 time and well protected from animals.
