STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED AND SEVENTY-EIGHT.

AN ACT to prevent vexatious law-suits.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

In all actions for injuries to the person, commenced

- 2 in the superior court of any county, or in the supreme
- 3 judicial court, on motion of the defendant, the court
- 4 may, if in his opinion justice so requires, order the
- 5 plaintiff to give bond to the defendant in such sum
- 6 and with such surety or sureties as the judge shall
- 7 approve, for the payment by the plaintiff of all costs
- 8 which shall be recovered against him; and in default
- 9 of compliance with said order, within such time as the
- 10 court may direct, the plaintiff shall become non-suit.
