RESOLVE in favor of Ida Brown.

Resolved, That the land agent be authorized to con-2 vey to Ida Brown, lot number seventy-six, in the

STATEMENT OF FACTS.

The lot has been fully paid for in road labor. By chapter 138 of the resolves of 1873, the Land Agent was authorized to convey this lot to Addison J. Brown, husband of said Ida, provided he should pay for the same within two years from the passage of said resolve. Several years ago Brown abandoned his wife and family and went to Pennsylvania, having sold his interest in the lot to another. Since then Mrs. Brown has purchased the certificate of the lot, and now asks that the Land Agent be authorized to convey the same to her, waiving further settling duties.
