STATE OF MAINE.

RESOLVE in favor of township number twelve, range five, west from the east line of the state, known as Sheridan plantation.

Resolved, That the land agent be authorized and 2 directed to pay to the treasurer of state the sum of three 3 hundred and seventy-five dollars and interest thereon, 4 from October first, eighteen hundred fifty-five, being 5 for money received by the state from the sale of 6 the right to cut timber and grass on the reserved lands 7 in township number twelve, range five, west from the 8 east line of the state, known as Sheridan plantation, 9 and said state treasurer is hereby directed to credit 10 the same in account with the school fund of said town- 11 ship.

STATEMENT OF FACTS.

This sum was received by the Land Agent in 1855, but was never set apart for the school fund of the township according to law. The inhabitants are legally and equitably entitled to the amount.
