STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED AND SEVENTY-EIGHT.

AN ACT to extend the jurisdiction and authority of county commissioners.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

SECTION 1. County commissioners in their counties

- 2 may, upon the same petition, lay out, alter, or dis-
- 3 continue highways, through a town or towns, or a
- 4 plantation or plantations, and tracts of land not in any
- 5 town or plantation; and in respect to that part of the
- 6 highway situate in any town or plantation required by
- 7 law to raise money to make and repair highways, the
- 8 same proceedings shall be had as is now provided by
- 9 law in case of a petition to lay out, alter or discon-
- 10 tinue highways leading from town to town; and in
- 11 respect to that part of the highway not situate in any

12 town or plantation required by law to raise money to 13 make and repair highways, the same proceedings shall 14 be had as is now provided by law in case of a petition 15 to lay out, alter or discontinue a highway in places 16 not incorporated. The time and place of hearing upon 17 such petition shall be according to section thirty-three, 18 chapter eighteen of the revised statutes. In case of 19 an appeal to the supreme judicial court, the appeal 20 shall be made at any time after the return of the com-21 missioners has been placed on the files, and before the 22 next term of said court in the county; and the pro-23 ceedings upon the appeal shall be according to section 24 thirty-five, chapter eighteen of the revised statutes. 25 If no appeal is made the case is to be continued to the 26 next regular term after the regular term to which the 27 return is made.
