STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED AND SEVENTY-EIGHT.

AN ACT to amend chapter two hundred thirty-four of the public laws of eighteen hundred seventy-four, concerning tax titles.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

SECTION 1. Chapter two hundred and thirty-four of 2 the public laws of eighteen hundred seventy-four is 3 hereby amended by adding the words "or treasurers" 4 after the word "collectors" in the sixth line of the 5 first section. Also by adding the words "or treas-6 urer" after the word "collector" in the fifteenth line 7 of said section, so that said section as amended shall 8 read as follows:

9 Sect. 1. Sections one hundred and sixty-two and 10 one hundred and seventy-four of chapter six of

11 the revised statutes, are each amended so as to read 12 as follows: In any trial at law or in equity, involving 13 the validity of any sale of real estate for non-payment 14 of taxes, it shall be sufficient for the party claiming 15 under it in the first instance, to produce in evidence 16 the collector's or treasurer's deed duly executed and And then he shall be entitled to judgment 17 recorded. 18 in his favor, unless the party contesting such sale 19 shall prove to the court that he or the person under 20 whom he claims, has paid or tendered the amount of 21 all such taxes and the legal charges and interest 22 thereon, and all costs of suit, and then he may be 23 admitted to prosecute or defend, but if the other party 24 then produces, in addition to the deed as aforesaid, 25 the assessments signed by the assessors, and their 26 warrant to the collector, and proves that such collector 27 or treasurer complied with the requirements of the 28 law in advertising and selling such real estate, he 29 shall have judgment in his favor.

SECT. 2. This act shall take effect when approved.
