STATE OF MAINE.

RESOLVE for the appointment of a commission to revise
the militia laws.

Resolved, That the governor be requested, in his discretion, to appoint a commission consisting of three persons, whose duty it shall be, without expense to the state, other than necessary expenses actually incurred to revise, amend or add to the laws relating to the militia, as they in their judgment believe to be for the best interests of the state, and report the same to the legislature.
