STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED AND SEVENTY-EIGHT.

AN ACT to amend chapter two hundred and thirty-two of the public laws of eighteen hundred and seventy-four, relating to the collection of taxes.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

- SECTION 1. Chapter two hundred and thirty-two of
- 2 the public laws of eighteen hundred and seventy-four,
- 3 is hereby amended, so as to read as follows:
- 4 Sect. 1. In addition to the methods now provided
- 5 by law for the collection of taxes legally assessed in
- 6 towns against the inhabitants thereof, or parties liable
- 7 to taxation therein, an action of debt may be com-
- 8 menced and maintained in the name of the inhabi-
- 9 tants of any town to which a tax is due and unpaid,
- 10 against the party liable for such tax; provided, how-

- 11 ever, that no defendant in any such action shall be
- 12 liable for costs of suit, or any part thereof, unless it
- 13 shall appear by the declaration in the writ and proof,
- 14 that payment of said tax had been duly demanded
- 15 prior to the commencement of such suit. Upon judg-
- 16 ment rendered in any such action, the execution shall
- 17 run against the body of the judgment debtor, provided,
- 18 the execution shall state that it is issued upon judg-
- 19 ment rendered in an action for the recovery of taxes.
 - Sect. 2. It shall be deemed a sufficient demand for
 - 2 the purpose named in section one of this act, if the
 - 3 collector cause to be given to the person assessed, or
 - 4 to be left at his last and usual place of abode, a notice
 - 5 signed by the collector, stating the amount of tax due
 - 6 and demanding payment thereof.
