### RESOLVE relating to the currency.

---

WHEREAS, The people of the State of Maine believe  
2 in a sound currency ; and that no currency is sound  
3 unless it be upon a gold basis. That any attempt to  
4 displace gold and substitute silver or anything else in  
5 lieu thereof, is fraught with every conceivable evil,  
6 dangerous to public and private credit, disastrous to  
7 business, injurious to all classes and especially to the  
8 laboring classes. Therefore,

*Resolved,* That our senators and representatives in  
2 congress, in their well directed efforts to defeat the  
3 passage of any and all bills the tendency of which is  
4 thus to demoralize the currency, are but giving voice  
5 to the well settled convictions of the people of this  
6 state.
