STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED AND SEVENTY-EIGHT.

[S. 4.] AN ACT to amend chapter one hundred and twenty-four, section eighteen of the revised statutes, relating to camp-meetings.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows :

Section eighteen, chapter one hundred and twenty-four of the revised statutes, is hereby amended, by inserting in first line after the word "elder," "officers or;" also after words " of a " in second line, " religious or temperance," so that said section shall read :

Sect. 18. On application of the presiding elder, officers or preachers in charge, or tent-masters, of a religious or temperance camp-meeting in any town, the municipal officers thereof shall appoint in writing, signed by a majority of them, one or more police offi-

11 cers, to preserve the peace during such meeting, who
12 may arrest any person violating any provision of the
13 preceding section, detain him until a warrant can be
14 issued, and execute such warrant when directed to
15 them. And the presiding officer or committee of
16 arrangements of any such religious assembly or meet-
17 ing, may appoint some suitable person to keep board-
18 ers and sell refreshments at such meetings, who shall
19 conform therein to such regulations as the officers ap-
20 pointing them prescribe.
