[S. 4.] RESOLVE relating to temperance.

WHEREAS, The use of alcoholic liquors as a beverage
2 has a direct tendency to destroy domestic happiness,
3 corrupt society, encourage crime, and drag men down to
4 poverty, pauperism, degradation and ruin. Therefore,

Resolved, That the noble men and women of the State
2 of Maine who have so faithfully and earnestly labored
3 to suppress the evils of intemperance, and to reform
4 and elevate the inebriate, are entitled to and should
5 receive the commendation and the energetic support of
6 all good people within our borders.
