STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED AND SEVENTY-EIGHT.

[S. 31.] AN ACT additional, relative to the Boston and Maine Railroad.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

SECTION 1. The Boston and Maine Railroad may, 2 by a vote of its directors or stockholders, discontinue 3 the location of so much of its railroad as lies between 4 the westerly side of Portland street, in the village of 5 South Berwick, and the junction of the Boston and 6 Maine Railroad with the Portland, Saco and Ports-7 mouth Railroad at South Berwick junction, so called; 8 and thereupon may remove therefrom the superstruc-9 ture and buildings owned by said corporation, and 10 shall be relieved from the duty of operating said por-11 tion of its railroad.

SECT. 2. This act shall take effect on approval.
