STATE OF MAINE.

[S. 9.] RESOLVE authorizing the conveyance of certain lots of land in the east half of township number two, range five, west from the east line of the state, in the county of Aroostook.

Resolved, That the land agent be, and he is hereby
2 authorized to convey to the person or persons lawfully
3 holding the land certificates of lots numbered eleven,
4 range one, twelve, range one, two, range three, one,
5 range four, two, range four, three, range four, five,
6 range four, ten, range four, four, range five, five,
7 range five, eight, range five, and ten range five, in
8 the east half of township number two, in the fifth
9 range of townships west from the east line of the state,
10 in the county of Aroostook, known as Silver Ridge
11 plantation, on payment of the balance of road labor,

12 at fifty cents per acre, due on any of said lots, and in
13 addition thereto, twenty cents per acre in cash for the
14 use of the state, waiving all further settling duties.

STATEMENT OF FACTS.

These lots are covered with a mixed growth of timber, and are unsuitable for farming purposes. It was the opinion of the Committee, however, that if settling duties should be waived, the persons holding certificates should pay the State, in addition to the fifty cents per acre in road labor, twenty cents per acre in cash.
