STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED AND SEVENTY-EIGHT.

[S. 56.] AN ACT to create a lien on hemlock bark.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

SECTION 1. A person who labors at cutting and peeling hemlock bark shall have a lien thereon for the amount due for his personal services, which shall take precedence of all other claims, to continue for thirty days; *provided, however,* that such lien shall not continue after the bark shall have arrived at a market; and be enforced by attachment.

SECT. 2. This act shall take effect when approved.
