[S 17.] RESOLVE in aid of building a bridge over
Fish river in Eagle Lake plantation.

Resolved, That eight hundred dollars be appropriated
2 in aid of building a bridge over Fish river, in Eagle
3 Lake plantation, to be expended under the direction
4 of the governor and council.

STATEMENT OF FACTS

For House Document No. 42, entitled "Resolve in aid of building a bridge over Fish river in Eagle Lake plantation."

To the Honorable Senate and House of Representatives of Maine:

The undersigned beg leave respectfully to represent, that the State road from Ashland to Fort Kent, in the county of Aroostook, is very much out of repair, and will require quite an outlay of money to put the same in proper condition for public travel, and the safe transportation of the mails. But the matter to which we desire more especially to call the attention of the Legislature, is the dangerous condition of the bridge on this road, across Fish river, in township No. 16, range 7, Eagle Lake plantation, which *must* be rebuilt the coming season, and would in our opinion be unreasonably burdensome upon the inhabitants and owners of said township to rebuild, in addition to their assessments for repair of the road. We therefore recommend that an appropriation (\$1,000) one thousand dollars be made by the State in aid of rebuilding said bridge.
