STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED AND
SEVENTY-EIGHT.

[S. 75.] AN ACT additional to chapter five of the
revised statutes relating to the public lands.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives
in Legislature assembled, as follows :*

SECTION 1. That the land agent, under the direction of the governor and council, shall sell at public or private sale and convey any lots or parcels of land and islands, and rights to cut timber belonging to the state on such terms as they may direct, including lots set apart or surveyed for settlement, and at the time of sale not taken up by settlers ; also all lands and rights that may become forfeited for a non-performance of settling duties or other conditions; and also the right to cut timber and grass on lots reserved for public uses in

11 any township or tract of land until the same is incor-
12 porated or organized into a plantation. *Provided,*
13 that, until the lots set apart for settlement are sold as
14 aforesaid, they shall be subject to be taken up by set-
15 tlers in manner now provided by law.

SECT. 2. This act shall take effect from its approval
2 and all acts inconsistent therewith are repealed.
