STATEMENT OF FACTS.

SMYRNA MILLS, Dec. 14, 1878.

Hon. E. C. BURLEIGH, Land Agent:

Dear Sir: I want a deed of the south half of lot No. 25, in the southwest quarter of township No. 6, Range 4, now part of Merrill plantation. My son, Charles A., who died last July, had the certificate of the lot, which he gave me. The road work is done, and five acres cleared and into grass, and a new chopping made last summer. We intend to make a farm of it. We have a farm, but there is a mortgage on it, and I have no way of paying it. My husband died and left me in hard circumstances some years ago. If I do not get a deed I shall have no home.
