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## STATE OF MAINE.

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RESOLVE in favor of Charles B. Lovejoy of Perham  
plantation.

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*Resolved,* That the conditional deed of lot number one hundred thirty-one in Perham plantation, issued by Edwin C. Burleigh, land agent, November two, eighteen hundred and seventy-six, shall be regarded as carrying a full title to said land, and all settling duties not performed on said lot are hereby waived.

## STATEMENT OF FACTS.

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*To the Honorable Senate*

*and House of Representatives :*

The undersigned respectfully asks that the Land Agent be authorized to remit that part of the settling duties which requires the erection of a dwelling house, and actual residence on lot No. 131, in township No. 14, Range 4, Perham plantation. I have paid the road labor, cleared fifteen acres of land and seeded it down, and erected a framed barn on said lot, but am better accommodated to reside with my son, Elmer L. Lovejoy, on lot No. 132, which adjoins lot No. 131.
