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## STATE OF MAINE.

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RESOLVE in favor of the Passamaquoddy Indians.

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*Resolved,* That there be paid from the state treasury, to be expended under the direction of the governor and council, to the agent of the Passamaquoddy tribe of Indians, for the benefit of said tribe, as follows, viz: For May dividend, four hundred dollars; for November dividend, three hundred dollars; for distressed poor, two thousand dollars; for agricultural purposes, six hundred dollars; for bounty on crops for the year eighteen hundred and seventy-nine, three hundred dollars; for ploughing, one hundred and fifty dollars; for salaries of governors, one hundred dollars; for salaries of lieutenant governors, forty dollars; for wood, two hundred dollars; for repairs on road leading from Peter Dana's point to Granger turnpike, fifty dollars; for contingent expenses, one

17 hundred dollars; for educational purposes, three  
18 hundred dollars; for salary of priest, one hundred  
19 dollars; for dressing for land, one hundred dollars;  
20 for salary of agent, two hundred dollars; for con-  
21 tingent poor fund, five hundred dollars.
