## STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED AND .
SEVENTY-NINE.

AN ACT to amend chapter seventy-five of the public laws of eighteen hundred and seventy-eight, relating to fisheries and the propagation of fish.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

Section 1. Section nine of chapter seventy-five

- 2 of the public laws of the year eighteen hundred
- 3 and seventy-eight is hereby amended, so that as
- 4 amended it shall read as follows:
- 5 Sect. 9. No salmon, shad or other migratory fish
- 6 shall be taken or fished for within five hundred
- 7 yards of any fishway, dam or mill-race; nor be-
- 8 tween the Bangor and Brewer bridge over the
- 9 Penobscot river and the Water Works dam at
- 10 Treat's Falls on said river; nor between the

11 Augusta bridge over the Kennebec river and the 12 Augusta dam on said river, between the first day 13 of April and the first day of November in each 14 year, except by the ordinary mode of angling with 15 single hook and line or artificial flies; nor shall 16 hook and line or artificial flies be used at any time 17 within one hundred yards of any fishway, dam or 18 mill-race. The penalty for violation of this section 19 shall be a fine of not more than fifty nor less than 20 ten dollars for each offence, and a further fine of 21 ten dollars for each salmon, one dollar for each 22 shad, so taken.

- SECT. 2. Section twenty-one is hereby amended, 22 so that as amended it shall read as follows:
- 3 Sect. 21. The commissioners of fisheries may 4 set apart any waters for the purpose of cultivation 5 of fish, and after notice published three weeks suc-6 cessively in some newspaper published in the county 7 where such waters are located, no person shall take, 8 kill, or fish for any fish therein under a penalty of 9 not less than ten nor more than one hundred dol-10 lars, and a further penalty of one dollar for each 11 fish so taken or killed.
