STATE OF MAINE.

RESOLVE making appropriations for the Penobscot tribe of Indians.

Resolved, That there be paid from the state treas-2 ury, to the agent of the Penobscot tribe of Indians, 3 to be appropriated for the benefit of the said tribe, Forty-four hundred twenty-nine dol-4 as follows: 5 lars and seventy cents, amount of interest on their 6 trust fund held by the state for the benefit of said 7 tribe; eighteen hundred dollars for their annual seven hundred dollars for agricul-8 annuity; 9 tural purposes; four hundred and fifty dollars for 10 bounty on crops; two hundred dollars for salary of 11 agent; one hundred dollars to pay competent per-12 sons, to be employed by the agent, to assist and 13 instruct said Indians in their agricultural labors, 14 as follows: fifty dollars on Oldtown and Orson

15 islands; twenty-five dollars on Mattanawcook 16 island; twenty-five dollars on Hemlock, Sugar and 17 Olamon islands, on the same conditions as required 18 by chapter ninety-six of the resolves of eighteen 19 hundred and sixty-seven; three hundred and eighty-20 five dollars for schools, to be used in employing 21 competent teachers, viz: two hundred and fifty 22 dollars on Oldtown island, under the super-23 vision of the superintending school committee of 24 Oldtown; seventy-five dollars on Olamon island, 25 under the supervision of the superintending school 26 committee of Greenbush; sixty dollars on Matta-27 nawcook island, under the supervision of the super-28 intending school committee of Lincoln; and said 29 committee are required to report, as directed in 30 resolve approved March seventeen, eighteen hun-31 dred and sixty; and it is the duty of said agent to 32 see that the money is fully expended for the educa-33 tion of the children of said tribe; thirty dollars for 34 the purchase of a stove and repairing school house 35 on Mattanawcook island; one hundred doliars for 36 salary of their priest, provided he says mass at 37 least twenty-four Sundays during the year with 38 said tribe of Indians; fifty dollars for salary of their 39 governor; thirty dollars for salary of their lieuten-40 ant governor; one hundred and fifty dollars for 41 completing repairs on chapel on Oldtown island.42 All the foregoing sums to be paid under the direc-43 tion of the governor and council.
