IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED AND SEVENTY-NINE.

AN ACT to prevent the use of language which if printed or written would be criminally libellous.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

Section 1. No person shall use language to, of,

- 2 or concerning another, which if written or printed
- 3 would be criminally libellous.

SECT. 2. Any person violating this act, shall be

- 2 liable to a fine not exceeding ten dollars, or im-
- 3 prisonment not exceeding thirty days.
