## STATE OF MAINE.

RESOLVE relating to survey and lease of lots on Indian township in Washington county.

Resolved, That chapter two hundred forty-six of 2 the resolves of eighteen hundred sixty-three, is 3 hereby amended by striking out the second resolve 4 and inserting thereof the following:

5 Resolved, That after the survey is returned as 6 aforesaid, the agent of the Passamaquoddy tribe 7 of Indians, or any other person who the governor 8 and council may appoint as agent for that purpose, 9 shall explore said lots whenever any are applied 10 for, and fix the price thereof, a schedule whereof 11 shall be lodged with the governor and council. 12 Said agent shall advertised said lots for lease, by 13 notice printed in the Washington county news-14 papers, and at any time after so advertising for 15 one month, said agent may lease said lots by

16 auction or by private sale, at a price not less than 17 the schedule price aforesaid, but no lots in the 18 occupancy of any Indian shall be leased. The 19 term of leases shall be for nine hundred any 20 ninety-nine years, terms of payment shall be one-21 third in cash at time of purchase, and the balance :22 in not more than three years, by notes of equal :23 annual payments, said notes secured by mortgage 24 on the premises. All money received from leases 25 aforesaid, shall be paid to said agent, and by him .26 paid over to the state treasurer, deducting there-27 from such compensation for his expenses and ser-28 vices as the governor and council may allow, and 29 the money so received by the state treasurer shall 30 be held in trust by the state for the benefit of said 31 tribe, the interest to be annually expended for 32 them. The leases shall be subject to any claims 33 of persons who have bought timber and grass on 34 said township, and none of them shall take effect 35 unless approved by the governor and council.
