STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED AND SEVENTY-NINE.

AN ACT to amend chapter twenty-seven, section twenty-two, of the revised statutes, as amended by chapter two hundred and fifteen of the public laws of eighteen hundred seventy-seven.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

SECTION 1. Chapter twenty-seven, section twenty-two of the revised statutes, as amended by chapter two hundred and fifteen of the public laws of eighteen hundred and seventy-seven, is hereby amended by inserting after the word "tippling purposes," in the sixth line, the words, "whether on the premises or elsewhere," so that said section will read:

9 *Sect. 22.* No person shall be allowed, at any
10 time, to sell by himself, his clerk, servant or agent,
11 directly or indirectly, any intoxicating liquors of
12 whatever origin, except as hereinafter provided;
13 wine, ale, porter, strong beer, lager beer, and all
14 other malt liquors, and cider when kept or deposited
15 with intent to sell the same for tippling purposes,
16 whether on the premises or elsewhere, as well as
17 all other distilled spirits, shall be considered intox-
18 icating within the meaning of this chapter. But
19 this enumeration shall not prevent any other pure
20 or mixed liquors from being considered intoxicat-
21 ing.

SECT. 2. This act shall take effect when approved.
