STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED AND
SEVENTY-NINE.

AN ACT to amend section four of chapter one hundred and thirty-two of the revised statutes, relating to jurisdiction of magistrates.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

Section four of chapter one hundred and thirty-two of the revised statutes is hereby amended, by adding after the words "ten dollars," in the last clause of said section, the words "or by imprisonment not exceeding thirty days," so that said section as amended shall read as follows:

Sect. 4. They shall have jurisdiction of assaults and batteries, breaches of the peace, and violations of any statute or by-law of a town when the offence

10 is not of a high and aggravated nature, and of of-
11 fences and misdemeanors jurisdiction of which is
12 conferred by law, and may cause affrayers, rioters,
13 breakers of the peace, and violaters of the law to
14 be arrested; and may try, and punish by fine not
15 exceeding ten dollars, or by imprisonment not ex-
16 ceeding thirty days, and may require them to find
17 sureties for keeping the peace.
