AN ACT additional relating to appeals in criminal cases.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

Sections fifteen and sixteen of chapter one hun-

- 2 dred and thirty-two, are hereby amended, so as to
- 3 read as follows:
- 4 Sect. 15. Any person aggrieved at the sentence
- 5 of such magistrate, may appeal therefrom to the
- 6 next supreme judicial court in the same county;
- 7 and the magistrate shall thereupon order him to
- 8 pay to such magistrate one dollar and fifty cents
- 9 for copies of papers for the appellate court, and
- 10 the entry fee in such court of sixty-five cents; and
- 11 shall also order him to recognize in a reasonable

12 sum, not less than twenty dollars, with sufficient

13 sureties, to appear and prosecute his appeal, and

14 to be committed till the order is complied with.

15 Sect. 16. The magistrate shall send to the appel-

16 late court a copy of the whole process, and of all

17 writings before the magistrate, and account to the

18 clerk of such court for the entry fee. If the

19 appellant does not appear and prosecute his appeal,

20 his default shall be noted on the record; and the

21 court may order the case laid before the grand

22 jury, or issue a capias against the body of the

23 appellant, bring him into court, and then affirm the

24 sentence of the magistrate with additional costs.
