Amend House Bill No. 63, by adding the following Amendments, viz:

Section eight of said chapter is hereby amended by 2 adding after the word "knowledge," in the fourth 3 line, the words "and shall have the same power as 4 sheriffs and deputy sheriffs to serve all criminal 5 process for the violation of any of the provisions of 6 this act," so that as amended the first paragraph in 7 said section shall read as follows, viz:

8 Sect. 8. The governor, with the advice of the 9 council, shall appoint fish wardens where the same 10 may be necessary, who shall enforce the provisions 11 of all public laws relating to fisheries; prosecute all 12 offences that come to their knowledge, and shall 13 have the same power as sheriffs and deputy sher-14 iffs to serve all criminal process for the violation of 15 any of the provisions of this act; and they shall 16 have a right at all times to visit any dam or any 17 weir or other apparatus for taking fish; and in the

18 exercise of their duties shall have the same right to
19 require aid that sheriffs and their deputies have in
20 executing the duties of their office, and any person
21 neglecting to render it when required shall forfeit
22 ten dollars.

Section fifteen of said chapter is hereby amended 2 by adding to said section the following paragraph, 3 viz:

4 "Provided, however, that during the months of 5 March and April in each year, it shall be lawful for 6 citizens of this state to fish for and take land-locked 7 salmon, trout and togue, and convey the same to 8 their own homes, but not otherwise."
