STATE OF MAINE.

[S. 3.] RESOLVE in favor of James Moore and David Moore of number eleven, range one plantation.

Resolved, That the land agent be authorized to
2 convey to James Moore and David Moore of num-
3 ber eleven, range one plantation, lot A 56, in said
4 plantation, waiving further settling duties.

STATEMENT OF FACTS.

James and David Moore own and live on lot No. 55, in No. 11, R. 1; that the public road passes through lot No. 55 in nearly a north and south course. They have both built on lot No. 55, and on the road, and have cleared and improved lot A, No. 56, as far back as we can remember, and raise hay and grain, and pasture the same, (lot A, No. 56.) That it is partly enclosed with the lot they live on. That by granting the request of their petition they would have equal to a hundred acres each. As the farms are now, each of them have a half of two lots,—James the north part of each lot, David the south part of each lot.
