STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED AND SEVENTY-NINE.

AN ACT to amend chapter sixty-three of the publiclaws of eighteen hundred and seventy-eight, relatingto the Maine Industrial School for Girls.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

Chapter sixty-three of the public laws of eighteen

- 2 hundred and seventy-eight, is hereby amended by
- 3 changing the word "ten" in the second line of sec-
- 4 tion first that it may read "seven," and so that sec-
- 5 tion one when amended shall read as follows:
- 6 A parent or guardian of any girl between the
- 7 ages of seven and fifteen years, or the municipal
- 8 officers or any three respectable inhabitants of any
- 9 city or town where she may be found, may complain
- 10 in writing to the judge of probate or any trial jus-

11 tice in the county, or to the judge of the municipal 12 or police court for the city or town, alleging that 13 she is leading an idle or vicious life, or has been 14 found in circumstances of manifest danger of fall-15 ing into habits of vice or immorality, and request 16 that she may be committed to the guardianship of 17 the Maine industrial school for girls. The judge 18 or justice shall appoint a time and place of hearing 19 and order notice thereof to any person entitled to 20 be heard, and at such time and place may examine 21 into the truth of the allegations of said complaint, 22 and if satisfactory evidence thereof is adduced, and 23 it appears that the welfare of such girl requires it, 24 he may order her to be committed to the custody 25 and guardianship of the officers of said school 26 during her minority, unless sooner discharged by 27 process of law.
