STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED AND SEVENTY-NINE.

AN ACT to amend chapter twenty-seven of the public laws of eighteen hundred and seventy-two, relating to lien claims upon animals.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

Chapter twenty-seven of the public laws of eighteen hundred and seventy-two, is hereby amended, so that said chapter, as amended, shall read as follows:

SECTION 1. Any person who pastures, feeds or shelters animals, by virtue of a contract with, or by consent of the owner, shall have a lien thereon for the amount due for such pasturing, feeding or sheltering, to secure payment thereof, with costs. Said lien shall continue for a period of thirty days

7 after said animals are taken away, and shall be
8 enforced by attachment and execution in courts of
9 competent jurisdiction, or in the same manner as
10 liens are enforced on goods in possession.

SECT. 2. This act shall take effect when approved.
