STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED AND SEVENTY-NINE.

[S. 10.] AN ACT to amend chapter fifty, section twelve of the public laws of eighteen hundred and seventy-eight, for the protection of game and birds.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

Section twelve of chapter fifty of the public laws 2 of eighteen hundred and seventy-eight, is hereby 3 amended, by striking out the words "or plover" in 4 the third line of said section, so that said section, 5 as amended, shall read as follows:

6 Sect. 12. No person shall kill or have in his 7 possession except alive, or expose for sale, any 8 wood duck, dusky duck, commonly called black 9 duck, or other sea duck, between the first day of 10 May and the first day of September; or kill, sell, or

11 have in possession except alive, any ruffed grouse, 12 commonly called partridge, or woodcock, between 13 the first day of December and the first day of Sep-14 tember following; or kill, sell, or have in possession 15 except alive, any quail or pinnated grouse, com-16 monly called prairie chicken, between the first day 17 of January and the first day of September follow-18 ing, under a penalty of not less than five nor more 19 than ten dollars for each bird so killed, or had in 20 possession, or exposed for sale.
