STATE OF MAINE.

RESOLVE to facilitate the settlement of the wild lands of Maine.

Resolved, That the governor, state treasurer and 2 land agent, be requested to notify the European 3 and North American Railway Company that so 4 much of the lands conveyed by the state to said 5 company, as in the opinion of the governor, state 6 treasurer and land agent, are suitable for settle-7 ment, shall be surveyed within a reasonable time 8 by said company into lots of suitable sizes for set-9 tlement, not exceeding one hundred and sixty acres 10 to any one lot, which lands shall be open to settlers 11 at a price not exceeding one dollar per acre, in 12 accordance with the provisions of chapter four 13 hundred and one of the public laws of eighteen 14 hundred and sixty-four, and the conditions of the 15 deed from the state to said company, dated May
