STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED AND
SEVENTY-NINE.

[S. 22.] AN ACT fixing the salaries of certain public officers and compensation of certain members of the government.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

SECTION 1. The governor of the state is entitled
2 to receive, after the first Wednesday of January in
3 the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred
4 and eighty, from the treasurer of the state, in
5 quarterly payments, on the first days of January,
6 April, July and October of each year, fifteen hun-
7 dred dollars.

SECT. 2. The following public officers are entitled
2 to receive from the treasurer of the state, in quar-
3 terly payments, on the first days of January, April,

4 July and October of each year, commencing March
5 first, eighteen hundred seventy-nine, which shall
6 be in full for all services.

7 SECRETARY OF STATE.

8 Secretary of state, twelve hundred dollars per
9 annum; deputy secretary of State, twelve hundred
10 dollars per annum. The clerk hire in this depart-
11 ment of state, a sum of money not to exceed the
12 sum of ten hundred dollars per annum.

13 TREASURER OF STATE.

14 Treasurer of state, sixteen hundred dollars, per
15 annum, and he is not to receive any other emolu-
16 ment or perquisite. For clerk hire in the office of
17 state treasurer, a sum of money not exceeding the
18 sum of twenty-two hundred dollars per annum.

19 ADJUTANT GENERAL.

20 Adjutant general nine hundred dollars per annum,
21 and he shall not receive any other fee, emolument,
22 or perquisite. The clerk hire in the office of adju-
23 tant general shall not exceed five hundred dollars
24 per annum.

25 WARDEN OF STATE PRISON.

26 Warden of state prison, fifteen hundred dollars
27 per annum, with the use without charge of such
28 part of the keeper's house and buildings of the
29 state appurtenant to the prison and yard, as the

30 governor and council may direct, and fuel for his
31 use, which shall be in full for all services, including
32 the duty of receiving and paying out moneys for
33 all purposes. Deputy warden of state prison, one
34 thousand dollars per annum.

35 Superintendent of public buildings, six hundred
36 dollars per annum.

37 Night watchmen at state house, not exceeding
38 two in number, five hundred dollars to each per
39 annum.

40 Judges of the supreme judicial court, each two
41 thousand dollars per annum, as new judges are
42 appointed, and whenever there shall be a vacancy
43 in the office of a judge of the supreme judicial
44 court, by death, resignation or otherwise, there
45 shall be no appointment to fill the same, but the
46 number of judges of said court shall thereafter be
47 limited to seven.

48 Attorney general, one thousand dollars per annum
49 in full for all services, expenses and travel.

50 Reporter of decisions, five hundred dollars per
51 annum, with the right to retain for his own use the
52 profits arising from a publication of his own reports,
53 said reporter, however, to comply with all the pro-
54 visions of section twenty-nine and section thirty
55 of chapter seventy-seven of the revised statutes.

56 Salaries to railroad commissioners five hundred
75 dollars to each per annum.

SECT. 3. Secretary of the senate, and the clerk
2 of the house of representatives, six hundred dollars
3 each in full for all services; assistant secretary and
4 assistant clerk, three hundred dollars to each in full
5 for all services. Said officers named in this section
6 are to do and perform all services similar to those
7 done and performed by the officers who held these
8 positions for the legislature of eighteen hundred
9 and seventy-eight. Messengers and assistant mes-
10 sengers to senate and to house, one hundred and
11 fifty dollars to each in full. Pages to senate and
12 to house of representatives, seventy-five dollars to
13 each in full.

SECT. 4. Bank examiner and insurance commis-
2 sioner, one and the same person to hold both offi-
3 ces, and perform all the duties pertaining thereto,
4 two thousand dollars per annum in full.

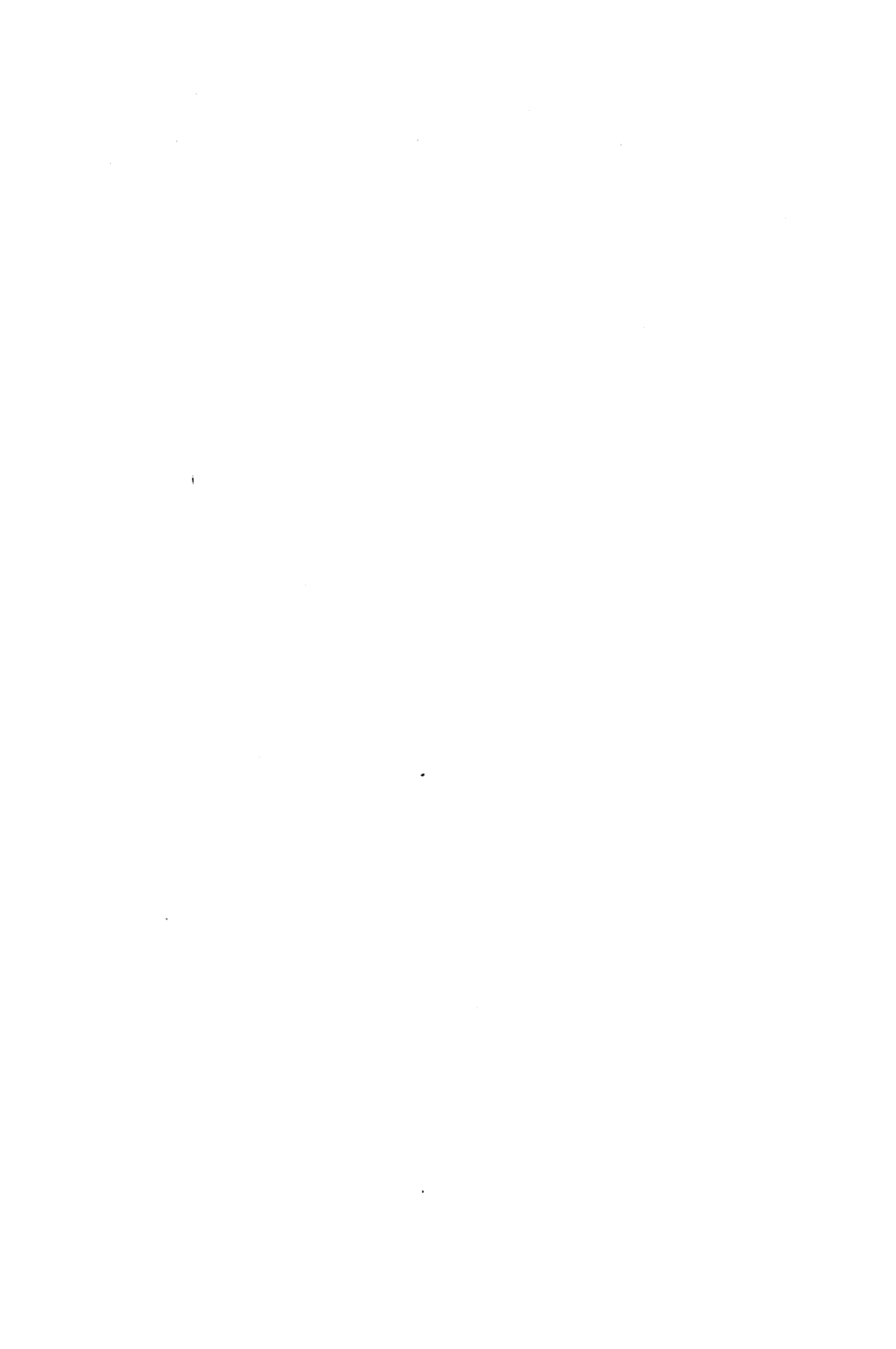
SECT. 5. The annual salary of the state librarian
2 shall be six hundred dollars in full for all services.

SECT. 6. Agent of Penobscot tribe of Indians,
2 two hundred dollars per annum. Agent of Passa-
3 maquoddy Indians, two hundred dollars per year.

SECT. 7. All acts and parts of acts inconsistent

2 with this act are invalid and of no effect, and the
3 same are hereby repealed.

SECT. 8. This act shall take effect when approved
2 by the governor.
